CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP

Persons may become members of this church on profession of living faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior, a sincere defice to live according to His will and for his glory, and the evidence of a consistent moral and christian character and life.

Members of other evangelical churches may be received on presentation of a letter of recommendation, or in case such a letter cannot be obtained, they may be received on giving evidence of being disciples of Jesus Christ.

Applications for membership shall be made to the Pastor, Deacons or Deaconesses of the church, who shall acquaint the applicant with the church manual and present him or her before a committee of three including the least of this committee is agreed in deemname for membership at any business meeting. Three-fourths of the votes of those present shall entitle the applicant to receive the right hand of fellowship.

BY-LAWS.

The officers of this church shall consist of the Paster, Deacons, Deaconesses, a Clerk and a Treasurer. The Senior Deacon shall be at the same time a class-leader. These officers and three other members of the church, shall constitute a committee on discipline and oversight.

At any time when the pastorate of this church may be vacant, it may be filled by any minister of the Gospel on whom the church

may unite, and two weeks notice shall be given of the meeting at which this item of business shall be transacted. Two-thirds of the votes cast shall be required for the election of a minister to the pastorate.

The pastoral relation shall be regarded as permanent as long as both church and Pastor are satisfied with its continuance, and when either party shall desire its discontinuance, the other shall be entitled to one month's notice of such desire.

To request the resignation of a Pastor the votes of two-thirds of the members present shall be required. This request shall be presented to the Pastor in writing with the signatures of those whose votes have been given.

No Pastor shall hold the pastorate of this church who is not in the experience of entire sanctification, so that he has a pure heart, is kept from sin, and leads a holy life according to our confession of faith.

service, report the same to the Church for its action. An absence of three months from the Lord's Supper, public, business, and other meetings without a valid excuse will render necessary an explanation to the Pastor, Deacons or Committee on Discipline and Oversight. If this explanation is not made through neglect or refusal, or if it should not be satisfactory, that shall be sufficient reason for bininging it before the Church for its action.
